Architectural

Exteriorly the house has been renovated thoroughly. The house was insulbrick but has been covered with vinyl siding so that there required lower maintenance to the house. The chimney at the rear of the house has been covered with cement blocks (Fig 2). A small addition has been added to the front south end of the house (Fig 1). It acts as a closed in front porch. The windows have all been replaced as well. Therefore, exteriorly the house does not appear to be of any architectural significance because there is nothing original. However, inside the home, the house remains relatively as it was built. There is a large, wide central stair case and the house contains original hard wood floors. The walls still are original plaster and have not been converted to drywall.

Historical

The earliest owner of the property on the Registry list was John Bannister who was David Bannister's son. David Bannister was the first settler to Waverley in 1829. He was a retired soldier who served for Canada during the war of 1812. He was originally from Leicestershire, England and settled with his wife in Waverley. John Bannister took over the properties of David Bannister after his death. Lot 76 was the original lot that was settled in Waverley. This house however, was not the original one because it was built 56 years after David Bannister settled on the property.
